

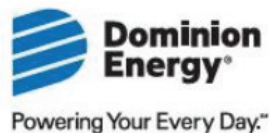

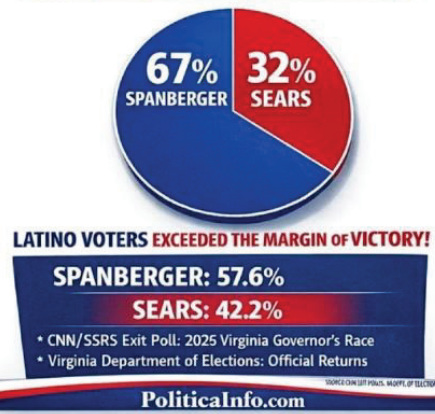
Did you know? Data from Virginia LULAC:

Virginia is home to over **900,000 Latinos**, representing roughly **10.6 %** of the state's population. ([Encyclopedia Virginia](#)) This growing demographic is economically, socially, and culturally woven into the fabric of our Commonwealth.

Why Our Vote Matters:

- **Economic stake:** Latino-owned businesses are thriving in Virginia. According to the U.S. Small Business Administration, Hispanics make up approximately **9.5 %** of workers and own **9.2 %** of small businesses in the state. ([Office of Advocacy](#))
- **Projected growth:** The Latino population in Virginia is among the fastest growing. Projections suggest Latinos could make up **17 %** (over 1.6 million persons) of the state's population by 2030. ([vlab.virginia.gov](#))
